A Year (9)

A broad curriculum where students experience a wide range of subjects and prepare for key stage 4 courses.

I & E Year (10 & 11) GCSEs / Cambridge Nationals

At 16 students take public exams in either GCSEs or Cambridge Nationals. Both are equal in terms of moving on to next steps. The Cambridge courses are more coursework heavy.

E Year trial exams – at the end of the Autumn Term / Spring Term




Homework Timetables


Students have homework set by nearly all subjects over the two week period. They should be 30 - 45 minutes long, but this depends both on the student and on where the class are up to.

Homework is important, students having time and space to complete work at home is a key way we as parents can support the college.




Target setting at Freman

- A score of 100 is average
- An organisation called FFT collect KS2 scores from the DfE for every student in the country
- They can estimate what GCSE grades students are most likely to get based on their KS2 scores





Microsoft 365 (Office 365)


Expectations

Behaviour and attitude to learning

High expectations of students

 We seek to create an environment in which students and staff feel secure and happy and in which high quality learning can take place.

• Expectations are clearly explained to students through assemblies / tutor time.



- Attendance –
- A Year-to-date overview of attendance and punctuality
- Able to see the attendance marks for the current day.

Attendance


- Freman expectation of a minimum of 95% attendance.
- Half termly letters flagging concerns and in serious cases may include AIO involvement
- Fixed Penalty Notices for poor attendance.
- Pupils with an attendance rate of 95-100% were 2 times more likely to achieve the Grade 5 in English and Maths GCSE compared to pupils who only attended 90-95% and 3 times more likely that those below 90%
- Every 5 days of school missed per year reduces chances of achieving a 5 or above by 20%

How to help:

- Please avoid holidays in term time.
- Let the office/tutor know if student is absent.
- Avoid making medical appointments during the school day where possible.
- Ensure student goes via the office if unwell don't take the call of "I want to come home".

Detentions

 A list of upcoming and past detentions with details of reason and update on attendance.



Sanctions and interventions

Tutors and HoH will inform parents/carers if students are not meeting our expected standards.

Sanctions can include:

- teacher speaking to the student on a one-to-one or small group basis.
- detention at break or lunchtime.
- one hour after-college detention.
- internal exclusion (isolation).
- Very serious incidents may involve a suspension or ultimately permanent exclusion from college.
